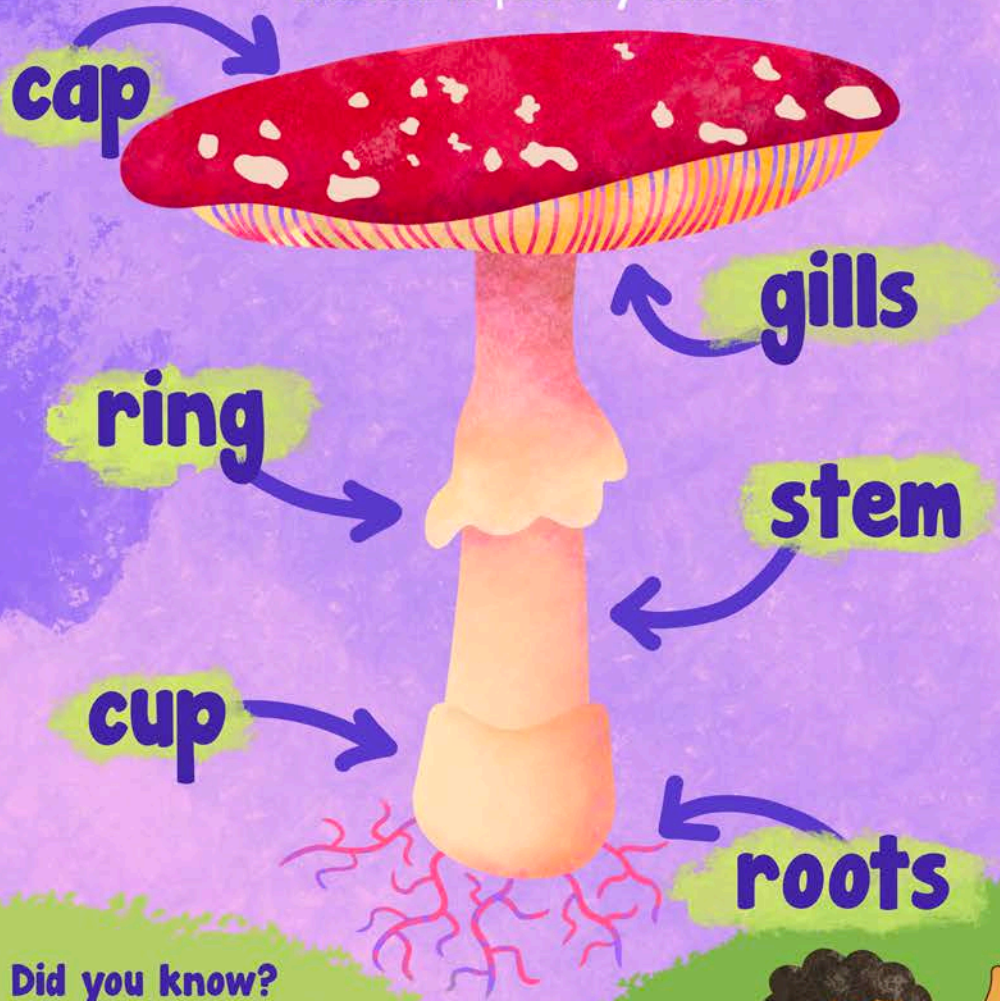

Get to know about mushrooms!

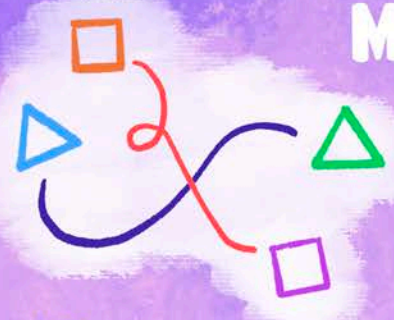
Mushrooms come in many shapes and colours, and they mostly grow mostly in humid spaces, where there are more water vapour in the air, like in Singapore! Did you know?
Mushrooms are classified as Fungi! They breathe and reproduce as a living being should, but they do not digest food like animals or benefit from the sunlight like plants do.



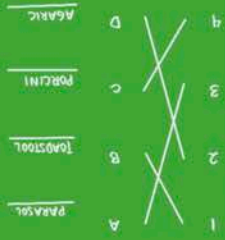

Mushrooms are tasty and healthy, but some are actually poisonous! Follow the guide below and you may miss some delicious fungi, but at least you will be safe!

Cross out mushrooms that you think are poisonous!
Look at the guide on the left if you need hints!

Avoid mushrooms with:

Bright Colours

Red capped fungi are well known to be poisonous, avoid other colours that scream 'Do not eat me,' like strong orange or blue.



White Gills and/or Rings

Most fungi with them are mainly inedible, but they are easy to spot and avoid.



Changing forms or colours

Just like other living beings, fungi have defensive systems. If a fungus changes its colours or lets out fumes or liquid, do not go near it!



There are no wrong answers here, if you feel unsafe about picking a mushroom, it is right to avoid it.

Mushrooms are everywhere!

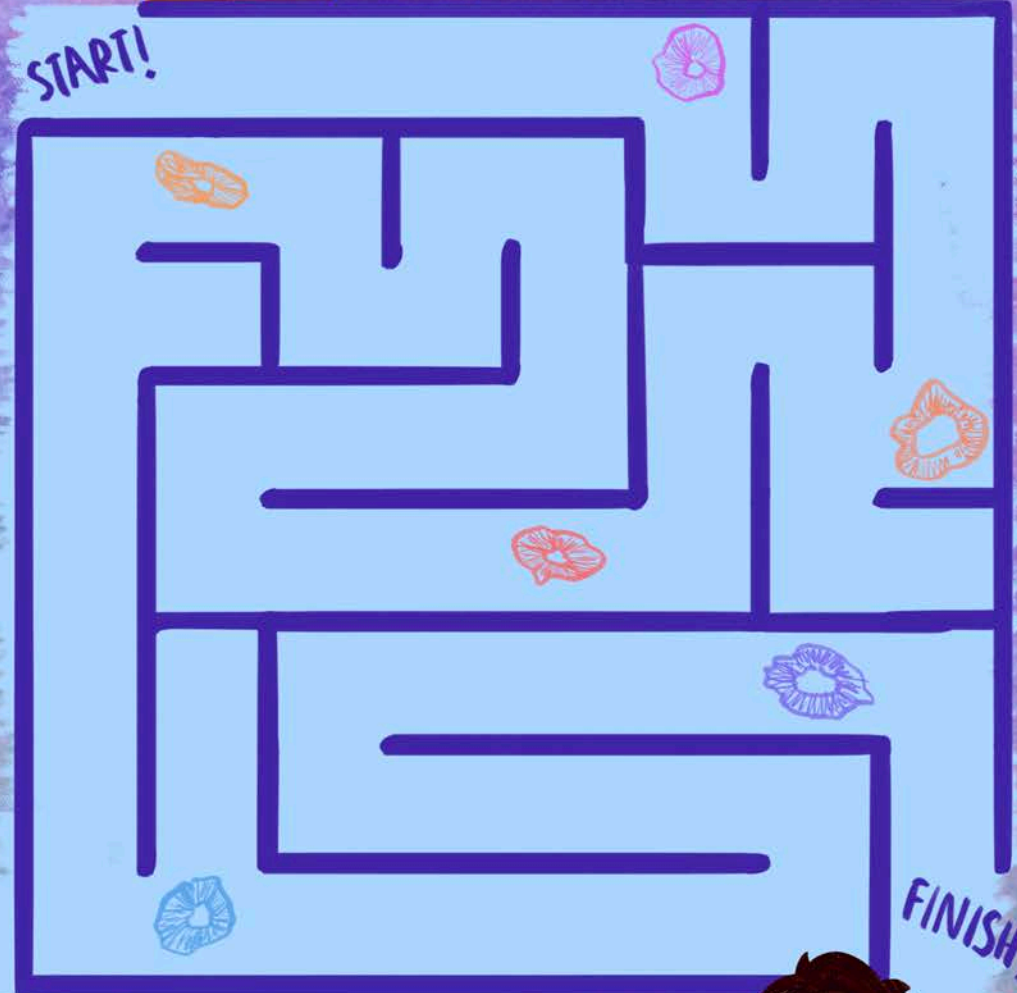
After it rains heavily, mushrooms can grow overnight!

Mushrooms hold up to 1.6 Billion spores that can grow as new mushrooms!

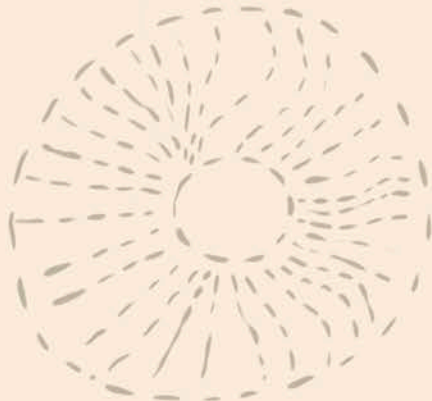


If you place a mushroom gill on a piece of paper, you can see its spore print!
